INSURANCE DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Before you disappear over the horizon with sun lotion in one hand and the children in the other, there a few things you should do for your home and personal security.

Insure to live.

IE Take out insurance to cater for continued GOOD life after the event.

- 1. Leave a spare set of keys as well as your destination / itinerary and relevant contact details with a trusted neighbour / friend or relative. (Trustee)
 - Why? In case of emergency, such as theft, fire or resetting the alarm.
 - A malfunctioning alarm is a 'call tone' for thieves.
- 2. Take the contact N° list of your plumber, electrician, garden service etc with you and leave a copy with your trustee. (1)
- 3. Test the alarm system at least one week before you go away.
 - Notify them of your absence.
 - b. Get confirmation from them of your absence and provide them the contact person's details for whilst you are away.
 - Get confirmation from them of your contact details, (when & what numbers etc)
- 4. Lock valuables & weapons in a safe or a bank deposit box. (Don't leave the key at home!)
- 5. Lock the outside mains box to prevent any tampering. (Thieves disconnect the electricity and wait for the back up battery to run dry before breakin
- 6. Make sure that your insurance details ar
- 7. Pay the water and electricity bills to ensure unlaterrupted sur
- 8. Check that you have water leakage over your insura
- 9. Make sure that the valuables you take w
- 10. Take your medical aid card with you.
- 10. Take your medicar and card with you.

 11. Ask trustee to keep an eye your property, hopefully twice a day, to keep the driveway cleans. put black bags out, etc.
- 12. Make sure that you have lights on a timer switch.
- 13. Ensure that you have sufficient funds available to pay for emergencies. (Not in a 32 day acc!)
- 14. Disconnect all electrical appliances at the wall; TV's DVD's PC's Clocks Geysers.
 - The only things you leave working are the alarm, fridge & freezer.
- 15. Immobilise all vehicles that are left behind.
- 16. Make that all vehicles going on holiday are licensed, roadworthy, serviced and insurance premiums are up to date.
- 17. If you have vehicle tracking, test it at least one week before going away.
- 18. Does your insurance have road side assistance? If so, what is the telephone number?
- 19. Pay any outstanding fines; if you have not and you are stopped they may impound your vehicle. In that case where are your family going to go to? AND YOUR SHARES WILL DROP
- Driver's licence has to be up to date; it's near the time for renewals, in any case!! 20.
- 21. If travelling outside SA, make sure that:-
 - Your insurance covers you for where you are going.
 - b. You have the necessary driver's licence?
- Most of these things you do naturally, this is your own check list. 22.
- Take your spare car keys with, you don't need them at home! 23.
